

## **COL TERRY D. CARROLL BIOGRAPHICAL SUMMARY**

Colonel Terry “Chip” Carroll was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Field Artillery from Mississippi State University in 1973. He is a fifth generation Army officer. From 1974 until 1980, COL Carroll served in a variety of active, Army Reserve and National Guard units. Following an appointment into the Medical Service Corps and assignment to Ft. Sam Houston, TX in 1981, COL Carroll commanded Company D, 8<sup>th</sup> Medical Battalion, 8<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division, (Mechanized) in Mannheim, Germany from 1983 to 1985. He then served as 8th Medical Battalion S4 and Chief of Division Support Command Medical Operations, 8<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division, (Mechanized) in Bad Kreuznach, Germany.

Returning to Fort Sam Houston, Texas in 1986, he served as Chief of the Performance Measurement Branch, Directorate of Training and Doctrine, US Army Academy of Health Sciences, followed by Executive Officer of the Academy Battalion, Academy Brigade. In 1988, he was assigned to the 18<sup>th</sup> Medical Command in Yongson, Korea, as Operations Officer, and in 1989 he joined the Second Infantry Division in Tongduchon, Korea, where he served as Executive Officer of the 702<sup>nd</sup> Main Support Battalion. In July 1991, COL Carroll served as Deputy Surgeon in the Joint Special Operations Task Force for OPERATION PROVIDE COMFORT, followed by duty as the Operations and Training Officer, OACSOPS, HQ, 7<sup>th</sup> MEDCOM, Heidelberg, Germany.

COL Carroll then commanded the 125<sup>th</sup> Forward Support Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division, from its reactivation in Mannheim, Germany on 24 July 1992 until 20 July 1994, followed by assignment as the Senior Combat Service Support Observer/Controller at the Combat Maneuver Training Center (CMTC), Hohenfels, Germany. In 1996 he served as the Senior Medical Advisor to the Saudi Arabian National Guard, and returned to Germany in 1997 as Deputy Commander and Chief of Staff of the 30<sup>th</sup> Medical Brigade, V (US) Corps. COL Carroll then commanded the Walter Reed Army Medical Center Brigade from August 1998 until July 2000, followed by duty as the Deputy Theater Surgeon of the U.S. Pacific Command, until 2002. COL Carroll currently serves as Chief of Staff, Europe Regional Medical Command, in Heidelberg, Germany

COL Carroll holds an M.A. in history from Mississippi State University, an M.Ed in Educational Administration and a Ph.D in Education and Psychology from the University of Southern Mississippi. He is a 1991 graduate of the Command and General Staff College, and a 2001 graduate of the U. S. Army War College, where he received a Master of Strategic Studies degree.

COL Carroll’s 43 awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, (1OLC), the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal (8OLC), the Army Commendation Medal (40LC), the Southwest Asia Service Medal, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal (10LC), the Army Service Medal, the Korean Defense Service Medal, the NATO Medal (4<sup>th</sup> Award), the Humanitarian Service Medal (2OLC), 6 unit awards, including the Army Superior Unit Award (2OLC), the Joint Meritorious Unit Commendation (2OLC) and the Navy’s Meritorious Unit Commendation, the

Expert Field Medical Badge, and the Parachutist Badge. COL Carroll is a member of the Order of St. Michael (Aviation), Order of St. George (Armor), Order of St. Barbara (Field Artillery), and the Order of Military Medical Merit.

COL Carroll is an avid fixed wing aviator, with over 5000 hours of flight time. He is married to the former Katharina Bohnes of Regensburg, Germany. They have two children, Maximilian (6) and Anastasia (3). He has two sons on active duty serving in the OIF/OEF campaign. Andrew, 23, is a Combat Engineer, and Erik, 27, is a Navy SEAL.
