



Command Sgt. Maj. Gregory M. Griffin is a native of Mississippi. He entered the Army in September 1976 and graduated from Basic Training at Fort Jackson, S.C. He received Advanced Individual Training at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, where he was awarded the Military Occupational Specialty 91B, Combat Medical Specialist.

Maj. and Senior Enlisted Advisor at Blanchfield Army Community Hospital, Fort Campbell, Kentucky and Command Sgt. Maj. at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center. He is currently the Command Sergeant Major for U.S. Army Europe Regional Medical Command and the Command Surgeon for U.S. Army Europe and 7<sup>th</sup> Army.
