Colonel David D. Krieger graduated from the University of Iowa with a major in biochemistry in 1981. He completed medical school training at the Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine in 1985 and a subsequent Transitional Internship at William Beaumont Army Medical Center in 1986. Colonel Krieger served as flight surgeon at battalion and brigade levels before becoming the course director for the Army Flight Surgeon Primary Course in 1990. He was later named Army Aviation Center Flight Surgeon of the Year for 1991.

Colonel Krieger graduated with a Master of Public Health degree from Harvard University in 1992 and completed a U.S. Air Force combined residency in Aerospace Medicine and Occupational Medicine in 1994. He completed a Master of Business Administration degree from Colorado State University in 2003. Colonel Krieger is a 1995 graduate of the Army Command and General Staff College and has been selected to attend resident Senior Service College at a future date. Colonel Krieger is board certified in Aerospace Medicine and Occupational/Environmental Medicine by the American Board of Preventive Medicine and the American Osteopathic Board of Preventive Medicine.

In his most recent assignment, Colonel Krieger served as Commander, Kirk U.S. Army Health Clinic and Director, Health Services for Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland. He previously served as Deputy Commander for Clinical Services at Ireland Army Community Hospital, Fort Knox, Kentucky, Division Surgeon for the 1st Infantry Division, Wuerzburg, Germany, Multi-National Division (North) Surgeon, Tuzla, Bosnia-Herzegovina, and Commander, B Company, 168th Area Support Medical Battalion, Yongson, South Korea.

Colonel Krieger has been awarded the Meritorious Service Medal with four Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, the Expeditionary Forces Medal, and the NATO Service Medal. In addition, he has earned the Expert Field Medical Badge, the U.S. Army Senior Flight Surgeon Wings, and the U.S. Air Force Flight Surgeon Wings.
